About our organization:

Kids Incorporated of the Big Bend is a community-based organization whose mission is to “supporting and educating families with young children through quality early learning, health and family services.” Founded in 1972 by the late Budd Bell, Kids Incorporated operates 6 Early Head Start (EHS) centers providing comprehensive services to at-risk families with children from birth to age 3 and to pregnant women in Leon, Jefferson and Madison counties. This not-for-profit organization is a certified United Way agency.



About our catalog:

As you can imagine, our Early Head Start centers are active learning hubs. Imagine between 24 and 60 youngers 3 years of age and younger in classrooms of 8 children with 2 teachers each for 8 hours a day and you know there’s a lot going on! Between serving breakfast, lunch and a nutritious snack, there are books to read, art projects to complete, games to play, and lessons to learn. There are diapers to change, noses to wipe, teeth to brush (o.k., some of the children only have their very first tooth!) and wash cloths and bibs to launder.

In short, it takes a lot of materials to run 6 centers serving 236 children and the cost quickly adds up. Many of our supporters have asked about our needs and in response to these inquiries, we have prepared this catalog of items our centers use in large quantities in order to help our children meet their developmental milestones.
